#### **Training Programme -**

MATHURAPUR NIVEDITA MAHILA SAMITY tries to facilitate their requirement through vocational training for the mothers and youths to meet up their demand so as they can stand on there own and become self-sufficient.

The training programme includes both on the field and of the field. Apart form the vocational training programmes, sponsored training programmes arealso held with closed support from the local government institutions, schools, colleges, CBOs, etc.

Currently MATHURAPUR NIVEDITA MAHILA SAMITY is giving concentration on various field of training, such as jute bag making, jute rope making, jute carpet and mat making, radio and television repairing, computer educational programme, carpentry, honey production, tailoring, etc.

#### **Educational Programme-**

MATHURAPUR NIVEDITA MAHILA SAMITY aims to champion the rights of education through the development of education which will produce tools and resources for teachers and young people to explore social, economic, and environmental issues of sustainable development in their classrooms, communities, and around the state.

MATHURAPUR NIVEDITA MAHILA SAMITY Alternative Schooling is a non-conventional system to address the educational needs of the children the formal school is not able to reach. The last quarter saw significant development in Alternative Schooling . Important decisions were taken during the last meeting of the Executive Committee, which paved the way for facilitating smooth implementations of the schemes for Alternative Schooling.

MATHURAPUR NIVEDITA MAHILA SAMITY also works to create an appropriate learning and teaching environment for the under privileged and drop-outs students. Specially trained teachers work as itinerant resource persons by making regular visits and providing useful guidance to the students, and their teachers, principals and staff in conducting educational and co-curricular activities.

#### **Health Programme-**

##### **Blood donation Camp:-**

Blood donation Camp organized with the help of Central Blood Bank, Maniktala. 85 Donar donated Blood. Doner card distributed to the poorer section for operation purpose.

##### **Eye Camp:-**

Eye testing Camp was held to identify the cataract & power of eye. Free spectacles distribute to the B.P.L. Card holder & at the same time financial poor persons.

##### **Health Camp:-**

The health programme was established as a home for curing the deprived and underprivileged. With encouragement from the local community, and support from well wishers, the programme as it exists today steadily developed to become a charitable dispensary.

Today the "clinic" has developed into a diverse community health programme with an emphasis on health promotion, enabling people to care for their own health with improved awareness through health education, and integrated health and development at the village level. We continue to provide care in our clinics for nearly three thousand persons monthly.

The current programme is a holistic blend of allopathic and homeopathic care/cure offered, with loving kindness and compassion to India's most impoverished families and

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communities. The programme encompasses the following services.

- A general allopathic clinic with homeopathic clinic
- an allopathic medical practice for the management of tuberculosis, diabetes, HIV/AIDS, heart disease and other chronic and complex problems
- a mobile health programme serving villages in remote areas where there are inadequate health services
- an integrated Reproductive and Child Health Programme targeting women and children, offering health promotion, disease prevention, monitoring of growth and development in children
- an integrated, village-based health and development programme which focuses on creating village health communities which consider ways to improve health awareness and health practices in their villages
- a training programme for village health workers and traditional birth attendants
- a computerized data-base tracking patient visits, diagnoses, treatments and progress
